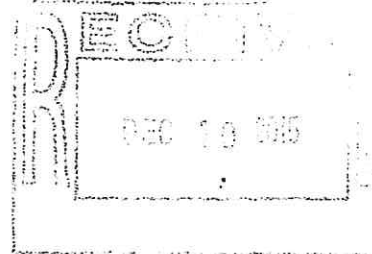

SUBJECT: Uncollectable Public Parking Citations

Per the attached request from Kirk Wendland, Executive Director of the Office of Economic Development, I am notifying you that I am "writing off" uncollectable parking citations from 1980 through 2010, per section 636.104(f) of the Ordinance Code. This portion of the Code reads that the memo requesting the "write-off" comes from the Director of Regulatory and Compliance Department. The Office of Economic Development has confirmed with the Office of General Counsel that they are the appropriate entity to initiate this action.

The uncollectable number of citations over this period is 191,500 with a value of \$11,016,589.71, per the attached. Due to the sheer volume of paper generated by printing the data, we did not provide an itemized list of individual entries documenting this information. However, the data is available in the Public Parking Office should you require it.


In an effort to clean up our processes and be in compliance with the Ordinance Code, it was discovered that this process had not occurred in quite some time, hence the large numbers.

SUBJECT: Write-off of Uncollectible Parking Citations

The Office of Economic Development, in accordance with Ordinance Code section 636.104 (f), is requesting that the Department of Administration and Finance write-off all uncollected public parking fines, along with the related penalties and late fees, issued prior to January 1, 2011. We have reviewed this matter with the Office of General Counsel, which concurs with our authorization to make such determination.

Based on the procedures in place within the Office of Public Parking and the information provided by Penn Credit Corporation, the collection agency contracted by the Office of Public Parking, the procedures outlined in section 636.104 (f) of the Code have been satisfied and the effort to pursue collection is no longer justified.
