Important information about your drinking water Baldwin Water System Chemical Monitoring Public Notice

What Happened?

Our water system did not meet the requirements of a drinking water rule. Although this is **NOT** an emergency, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your water meets health standards. During the 2015 monitoring period, we did not monitor or test for Inorganic Contaminants, Radionuclide Contaminants, Synthetic Organic Contaminants (SOCs), Volatile Organic Contaminant (VOCs), and Secondary Standards, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water at that time.

What should I do?

Some people who drink water containing Inorganic Contaminants, Radionuclide Contaminants, Synthetic Organic Contaminants, and Volatile Organic Contaminant could become seriously ill. Health effects language for individual contaminants can be obtained by contacting us at the number below. Any customers who are concerned about their exposure to the contaminants can choose alternative sources of water for ingestion.

What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.

What is being done?

At this time, all required monitoring has been completed and we are waiting for the results. This is a test The Town has always performed in the past and the town has always tested negative for these contaminants.
