Applicants must meet the criteria below in order to be considered for the CRC Foundation Scholarship for College-bound High School Seniors:

- Must identify as Black/African American
- Currently enrolled in a high school located in Arizona's East, West or Central Valley OR Denver, Colorado
- Must demonstrate academic promise
- Preference for students from families of multiple siblings
- Active in extracurricular, afterschool and/ or community service activities
- US citizen or hold a permanent resident visa card
- On track to graduate from an accredited high school in Spring 2017 at the time the application is submitted (college students are not eligible to apply)
- > Eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant in the first year of college
- Able to provide proof of acceptance to a full-time bachelors degree program at an accredited college or university with intended start date in Fall 2017.

The scholarship for college-bound high school honors the legacy of Charles R. Campbell and is a testament to his dedication – to helping young people fulfill their potential. To date \$50.000 in college scholarships have been awarded to deserving students. The CRC Foundation takes pride in providing young people with the encouragement, care and guidance they need to succeed on the collegiate level.

Calais Campbell and his seven siblings understand the joys and challenges of growing up in a large family. Their parents weathered a variety of storms to persevere in providing a loving upbringing to their children. Today, the Campbell's are each successful in their own right, attributing much of their success to the power of education.

CRC Foundation Scholars are students who demonstrate their desire and ability to overcome barriers and to achieve their goals. Applicants are evaluated based on:

- Individual determination to succeed
- Future goals and plans to achieve them
- Demonstrated financial need

Each Scholarship Applicant is Required to Submit:

- Completed application form
- Official academic transcript
- One (1) letter of recommendation
- Four (4) responses to required essay questions

Each Scholarship Awardee Receives:

- \$10,000 towards their academic expenses during their Freshman Year (Fall 2017 – Spring 2018)
- Beginning in their sophomore year (Fall 2017), each student has the opportunity to receive additional per-class, per-letter grade scholarships at the conclusion of each consecutive semester. Grades are verified by submission of an <u>official academic transcript</u> and written status report at the conclusion of each semester:
 - A = \$1,500
 - o B = \$1,000
 - o C = \$500
- The scholarship term ends at the conclusion of the student's Senior year or eight (8) consecutive semesters of academic enrollment, whichever sooner
- The scholarship is not applicable towards fifth-year or graduate school coursework
