

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017-130**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
EXTENDING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN NASSAU COUNTY, FLORIDA  
DUE TO HURRICANE IRMA**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida adopted Resolution No. 2017-128 on September 6, 2017 declaring a state of local emergency in Nassau County, Florida, due to Hurricane Irma; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners exercised its authority under Chapter 252.38(3), Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 252.38(3)(5) provides that the duration of the state of emergency declared locally is seven (7) days; and


**WHEREAS**, the seven day increment may be extended by a majority vote of the Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County, Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, as a result of Hurricane Irma's landfall, the County continues to address flooding and damage to areas within the County, and there exists a need to extend this local State of Emergency to facilitate measures to protect citizens, visitors and property.




