District Grade


A = 62 percent or greater, 677 points or greater

F = 31 percent or less, 346 points or less







While Duval County ranks 6th in the percent of A, B, and C schools, tied with Hillsborough, they have shown the **largest growth** in the percent of A, B, and C schools (23%) from 2014-15 to 2016-17.







Growth in Percent Proficient for FSA ELA and Math Among Grade Bands between 2014-15 and 2017-18







Growth in Percent Proficient for Science and EOCs Between 2014-15 and 2017-18
