Synopsis:

06-11 at 1435- No answer.

06-11 at 1343- No answer, and message left.

On 06-13-18 at about 14: 16, I made contact with the complaint, Kelvin J. Walker. I informed him that I had viewed the video and will be conducting the investigation. I also confirmed with him that he did not observe either CSO look at him as they turned around. I told him that I would contact him as soon as I completed my investigation.

I then made contact with each Community Service Officer, individually. They informed me that they were on their way to work, after picking up their assigned vehicles from Zone 4. As they entered into Zone 1, while on Interstate 95, a crash was dispatched. Both of them exited the Interstate. They stopped in the road and formulated a plan to turn around and go assist with the crash. They changed routes and went to assist with the other crash. Neither of them looked over and noticed the crash that occurred directly behind them.

Both stated, independently, that they would have stopped and assisted the driver behind them if they would have been aware of the crash.

Disposition- The complaint is not sustained. There was no undisputable proof that either Community Service Officer observed the crash, and therefore did not stop. They were given an informal counseling on their driving habits, and stopping in the middle of the road. Both were shown the dash camera video from the vehicle that stopped behind them, and then was rear ended. I made contact with the complainant, via phone, and explained to him that his complaint was not


sustained on the failure to take action, but the two were counseled on their driving habits. He was satisfied with this outcome.
